

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



WHY IS TRITAX PARK NEEDED?



Currently no available units over 100,000 sq ft in Greater Cambridgeshire.



Estimated 13.3 million sq ft of unsatisfied requirements for large-scale industrial and logistics space (>100,000 sq ft).



The A14 continues to serve as a key logistics and industrial corridor, supporting regional and national connectivity.



Many industrial estates have been repurposed for housing, offices, or laboratory uses, reducing available industrial land.



Remaining older industrial sites tend to be small, constrained, and outdated, limiting their suitability for modern, energy-efficient, large-scale operations.

CASE STUDY: SIEMENS HEALTHINEERS



Earlier this year, Tritax delivered the first phase of a new 604,000 sq ft global facility for Siemens Healthineers, the market leaders in magnetic resonance imaging (MRI).

This cutting-edge site strengthens Oxfordshire's position in advanced manufacturing and medical technology, providing a long-term home for the research, development and production of superconducting magnets uses in MRI systems.

Located 8.5 miles north of Oxford City Centre, Siemens Healthineers is making a major investment in Oxfordshire's economy. By 2040, the project will create around 1,126 jobs and contribute £250 million in investment.



COMMUNITY BENEFIT FUND

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


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




ABOUT THE SITE



Tritax Park Cambridge is located north of Bar Hill, separated from the village by the A14 and easily accessible from Northstowe, Longstanton and Oakington, making it a sustainable location for efficient last-mile logistics.



The site covers approximately 123 hectares and is outside of the Green Belt.



The A14 runs along the southwest of the site, while the A1307 to the south provides numerous pedestrian and cycle routes.



The eastern boundary is next to the B1050, which features pedestrian and cycle connections linking to neighbouring communities including Bar Hill, Northstowe and Longstanton.



The site is exceptionally well connected, with direct access to the eastwest A14 and north-south routes via the M11 and A1.




The first phase of Tritax Park Cambridge is backed by a leading occupier and will establish a new parcel distribution facility for a nationally recognised parcel delivery company, supporting sustainable logistics throughout Greater Cambridgeshire.

Tritax Park Cambridge could generate circa 2,500 - 3,000 jobs for local residents, with over 65% expected to be hands-on entry level roles.

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PUTTING SUSTAINABILITY AT THE HEART OF WHAT WE DO


Our commitment to sustainable low-carbon development is at the heart of every project.

At Tritax Park Cambridge, we are creating a future-ready business community built around environmental responsibility, innovation and long-term value.



Greener buildings

- All new buildings constructed to net zero carbon in construction principles, with EPC A ratings and BREEAM Outstanding ratings.
- Incorporating photovoltaic panels and air source heat pumps to maximise renewable energy use.
- Zero waste to landfill and green electricity tariffs through responsible facilities management.



Water conservation

- Rainwater and greywater harvesting systems to reduce potable water use.
- Smart metering, intelligent leak detection and low-flow fixtures to monitor and reduce consumption.



Future-ready transport options

- Extensive cycle parking and electric bike charging facilities across the park.
- Parking spaces equipped with EV charging points.
- Enhanced public transport connections, including improved bus services and pedestrian links.



Improving the local environment

- Retention of existing mature hedgerows, trees and woodland, supported with new planting throughout the development providing enhanced opportunities for carbon capture / storage and pollutant absorption, offering climate and air quality benefits.
- A minimum 25% Biodiversity Net Gain.
- Additional planting, including a variety of flowers.
- At least 40% of the site will be open green space.

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CREATING A PARKLAND SETTING FOR WORK AND NATURE



Active Social Node
Space designed for social interaction and activity, with space for small team building activities, or gatherings.

Emersion and Restoration Node
Create more secluded areas for restoration and relaxation. This will be aimed at individuals or small groups.

Circular Route
Circular route around the site
with multiple access points for
walking and running. Can also be

At least 40% of the site will be open green space, and the development will achieve a minimum 25% Biodiversity Net Gain — creating a sustainable environment where people, businesses and wildlife can flourish together.

The plan for landscape and green spaces shapes how the development will look and work. It aims to support health and wellbeing by:

- Creating a place with a clear identity and strong sense of community
- Making it easier for people to move around, with good links to existing paths and routes
- Providing new, safe, and accessible green spaces for people to enjoy, with a variety of outdoor facilities
- Improving existing natural habitats to boost biodiversity and create even better public open spaces



















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


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CONNECTED AND ACCESSIBLE



Tritax Park Cambridge is located alongside an existing pedestrian and cycle route, providing safe, convenient links between Longstanton, Northstowe and Bar Hill, making it sustainable and accessible for both existing and growing local communities to reach the new opportunities and parkland created.

We are talking with local stakeholders to explore ways to further enhance these connections, including new bus stops within the site to enable access by existing bus services that currently route between Cambridge City Centre and Northstowe / Longstanton (including the Guided Busway) via Bar Hill.

The proposed development will also include a network of safe and accessible walking and cycling routes, linking with current and future connections beyond the site.

A centrally located mobility hub is proposed adjacent to the primary bus stops, offering a convenient interchange between modes. The hub will include e-bike and e-scooter docking stations, along with sheltered waiting areas and other supporting facilities to encourage sustainable travel choices.

Through conversations with the local community, we are aware of concerns around HGV parking in nearby villages and the capacity of the Bar Hill Junction. We are committed to understanding and addressing these issues, working closely with the community and the Council to ensure the park is managed to the highest standards.

A detailed Transport Assessment is being prepared and will be submitted with a future planning application. It will outline the local transport context and the proposed development plans, including traffic forecasts and potential impacts on the road network. The assessment will be based on traffic survey data collected in summer 2025.

A Travel Plan will be prepared and submitted with the planning application. Its main goal is to encourage everyone using the development to travel in more sustainable ways, such as walking, cycling, car-sharing or public transport.

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WATER MANAGEMENT

We understand there are pre-existing concerns about flood risk and surface water management, primarily caused by the closure of the Webbs Hole Sluice Gate when river levels are high.

These issues are being carefully reviewed, and we will work closely with the neighbouring communities, the Council, and specialist teams to make sure Tritax Park Cambridge has safe, effective and high-standard drainage and water management systems.

When the Great Ouse water level is high and the sluice gate is closed, Tritax Park will store surface water on-site so that the development does not worsen existing flooding problems. We are actively considering how we can store additional water on site to the benefit of communities downstream.

During normal conditions, when the sluice gate is open, surface water will leave the site at the same (or reduced) rate as the undeveloped area.

Additionally, sustainable drainage systems and rainwater harvesting will be used within the development to reduce the amount of water leaving the site.

We are currently in discussions with Anglian Water regarding foul drainage connections and capacity.






